



## **Consortium Coordinator**

### **Humanitarian Response to Forgotten Crisis in Mindanao (\*Pending donor approval)**

#### **Rationale**

The project aims to help improve the living conditions of internally displaced populations affected by chronic conflict and armed violence, and natural hazards in Mindanao. Life-saving food, shelter, WASH and protection assistance will be provided by the project to internally displaced populations, particularly the Lumad and Moro people. The support will include provision of complementary cash grants and in-kind distribution of food, temporary shelters in evacuation sites, and WASH and protection services. Advocacy and communications will also be carried out to draw attention and support to this forgotten crisis. The project will be implemented in Caraga and Northern Mindanao regions, in Maguindanao province, in Marawi City, and in Lanao del Sur and Lanao del Norte provinces. The project will be implemented by a consortium of international NGOs and local NGOs, led by CARE.

#### **Role**

The Consortium Coordinator will be in charge of the overall management and progress of project implementation and shall lead the harmonization of approaches across geographic and thematic areas of implementation; coordination with local government units, national government agencies and humanitarian and development programs in the area; advocacy and communications activities; consolidation of narrative and financial progress reports; and quarterly updating of the donor.

#### **Qualifications**

- The aspiring Consortium Coordinator must possess adequate experience in humanitarian actions including in conflict situations, knowledge on food security, WASH, shelter and protection. The Manager should also have the capacity to lead the Action team in working for integration of age, gender, disability and social inclusion, and resilience.
- Experience working in European Commission (ECHO)-funded projects, and knowledge of ECHO funding guidelines, including financial rules and communications, visibility and information guidelines.
