Project Areas

Agriculture is the primary livelihood in the selected municipalities, with many families relying on farming and fishing. However, the recurring natural disasters (typhoons, volcanic eruptions, and flooding) have severely affected these livelihoods over the past five years. There is an urgent need to support the youth in developing sustainable agricultural practices and alternative incomegenerating activities to enhance their resilience and economic stability.

The EMPOWER the Youth project is designed to address these challenges by **focusing on the youth**, who are particularly vulnerable to disasters yet represent a significant demographic dividend. By providing training and employment opportunities, the project can significantly contribute to the socioeconomic development of the community.

600 young people women and men

These project participants will target male and female youth members of vulnerable households including the beneficiaries of DSWD 4Ps Program who are considered graduating or outgoing members and mostly belong to Level 2 category or "subsistence level".

Total Indirect Project Participants:

1,800 individuals

Strengthened livelihoods and resilience of **70% youth participants** of all genders in the Batangas Province.

Sustained engagement of youth in diverse, resilient income sources. (AGENCY & RELATION)



Strengthened service/support systems of stakeholders to enable youth's engagement in diverse, resilient livelihood activities (RELATION & STRUCTURE)

Increased access to inclusive youthoriented economic resources, services and livelihood options/opportunities.


